Analysis of Feedback from Employers



A Graphical Representation of the Collected Feedback Responses



32% of the employers reported the subject knowledge is relevance to working company is Excellent, 40% felt Very Good, 16% reported as Good, 4% registered as Satisfactory and 8% as Poor which shows the majority of employers are relatively happy with the quality of students' education.



36% of the employers rated as Excellent, 32% as Very Good, 20% as Good, 8% as Satisfactory and 4% as Poor which suggests that most employers are happy with the current technical skills.

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Employers rated 44% about the communication skills is Excellent, 28% as Very Good, 16% as Good, 4% as Satisfactory and 8% as Poor. This shows that employers are usually satisfied with the employees' communication abilities.



36% of the employers recorded that interpersonal skills as excellent, 20% as Very Good, 32% as Good, 4% recorded as Satisfactory and 8 % as Poor. This implied that the educational system offered a high degree of specialisation.

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


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8% of the employers recorded as Excellent about the ability to upgrade knowledge, 8% reported as Very Good, 20% as Good, 24% recorded as Satisfactory and 40% felt as Poor which results the need for better opportunity in knowledge updating by employees.



52% of the employers recorded as Excellent 32% rated as Very Good, 8% recorded as Good, 4% reported as Satisfactory and 4% as Poor. It suggests that curriculum concepts are related to career options.

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
