

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## A.P.C. Mahalaxmi College for Women, Thoothukudi - 2 ANNUAL REPORT (2022 – 2023)

With immense pleasure, we present you an overview of our institution's endeavours, accomplishments, and future aspirations over the past year. As we reflect on the past year, I am proud to showcase the progress of our college. The college offers 10 Aided Programmes, 10 Unaided Programmes, and 5 Research programmes. With the 653 freshers the academic year 2022 – 2023 commenced with the Student Council Election followed by the inauguration of the Student Council with the elected office bearers.

Our students have demonstrated excellence in the April 2022 examination. The college has a pass percentage of 93 percent in the April 2022 examinations. We are extremely proud to announce that 19 of our students have excelled by securing University Ranks.

In the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), our college has secured a place in the Rank Band I. We have been ranked as the college with the 2nd lowest fee structure college in Arts and Commerce and 6th lowest fee structure college in Science college by the India Today MDRF Best Colleges Ranking 2023.

To stay updated with the latest trends, research and teaching methodology our faculties attend Refresher Course and Faculty Development Programme for professional development. Dr. B. Abinaya Bharathi, Assistant Professor of English, Ms. J. Vasantha Sena, Assistant Professor of English, Mrs. R. Anista, Physical Education Director attended the refresher course this year. Our college has organized 3 Faculty Development Programmes for the Teaching Staff and 2 Faculty Development Programmes for the Non- Teaching Staff. In total, 97 teaching and 31 non teaching faculty have attended various Faculty Development Programmes. Out of them, fourteen faculty have attended Refresher Courses.

To enhance research our college research forum organised a programme on Integrity in Research and Nuances of Project Writing. An International conference on Applied Mathematics and Intellectual Property Rights ICAMIPR3 – 2022 was organized by the Department of Mathematics.

Entrepreneurship Development Cell organized an awareness Programme on Intellectual Property Rights. A Certificate Course on Junior M.B.A Programme was offered to the students in collaboration with Ekalai Academy in partnership with EDII – TN, Incubation Centres of Anna University.

"Guidance for Competitive Examinations and Staff Selection Commission Examination" was organized by the Career Guidance and Placement Cell. The Career Guidance and Placement Cell encouraged the students to participate in the various Placement Drive. Many students got job offers from the placement drive.

To emphasize women's equality the Women Empowerment Cell (WERA) organized programmes on "Celebrating Women's Right to Vote", a gender sensitization programme on "Gender Issues and Women's Health." A mini Exhibition was organized in collaboration with Tailoring Unit of Maha Fashion. 

True to the chosen vision and mission of uplifting the socially marginalized and economically less privileged sections of society, the most respected serving President of our College Management Committee, honourable Shri. A.P.C.V. Chockalingam, has been working tirelessly to help the college evolve into one of the high-ranking institutions. Esteemed Madam Secretary, Smt. Subbulakshmi Chockalingam, has also been greatly instrumental in enabling the college to empower its students with essential education along with the noble ethos and the rich tradition of our culture.

In the academic year 2021- 2022 despite the challenging backdrop of the ongoing COVID-19 situation, our college has demonstrated remarkable resilience and proactiveness. The college has demonstrated a commendable level of academic activity and adaptability. In response to the circumstances, the college swiftly transitioned to online learning modalities, ensuring that academic continuity was maintained without compromising the quality of education. In the April 2021 University Examinations, a 99% pass has been recorded in all the UG & PG programmes, and 11 students have secured university ranks.

Faculty have demonstrated excellence in both teaching and research. They have participated in 96 International, 175 National, and 26 State-level seminars and have presented papers in 100 International and 7 national conferences. They have also published research articles in 122 International journals and published 26 books. Also, the college organized 12

Faculty Development Programmes for teaching staff and 6 programmes for non-teaching staff. 96 teaching and 22 non – teaching faculty have attended Faculty Development programmes during the academic year. Three faculty have attended Refresher Courses and three others, Orientation Programmes. 

I am happy to present the annual report for the academic year 2020 – 2021. This year marks the 48th year of A.P.C. Mahalaxmi College for Women's service in higher education for women. The college, founded in 1973, has made significant contributions to rural women and has developed academic programmes in accordance with its founder's vision and core values. The college motto, "Anbu, Arivu, and Aram" (Love, Knowledge and Virtue), reflects its commitment to providing highquality education and prioritizing personal values and social responsibility.

The curriculum promotes national development, fosters global competencies, and facilitates skill development training. The college also promotes environmental awareness, community service, and research activities. The college's strength lies in its commitment to teaching excellence and value-based holistic education, enabling students to participate fully in developmental and transformative actions benefiting the community and society. The faculty members represent the best minds in various disciplines, contributing to the intellectual growth of students and encouraging their growth.

The college offers seven aided and three UG unaided programmes and two aided and three unaided PG programmes. Our college has an efficient mentor mentee system to monitor academic progress and student welfare. The college focuses on promoting teacher excellence and has organized various faculty development activities, including seminars, workshops, and conferences. The college has upgraded its infrastructure, including smart board facilities, Wi-Fi connections, video conferencing, and improved laboratories. Our college Library provides a vast collection of books, journals, databases, and other online resources to support academic and research activities. The college's IQAC is a nodal centre for quality sustenance and enhancement, organizing capacity building sessions and programmes for faculty and students.

The college has recorded a pass percentage of 96% and twenty three University Ranks in the April 2020 examinations. Faculty members at the institution have been recognized for their hard

work and selfless service. The Department of Tamil has organized a National Seminar and published 10 research papers in UGC Approved Journals. The Department of English has promoted continuous improvement in academic, social, and moral aspects through periodic talks, lectures, and workshops. The Department of Mathematics has organized a two-day International Virtual Conference on "Applied Mathematics and Intellectual Property rights". The Department of Commerce (Aided & Unaided) has published 18 research papers in UGC Approved Journals and 8 in Scopus Journals, and 9 research papers in proceedings. The Department of Computer Science has organized a two-day International Conference on "ICRTMDR" in collaboration with IFERP and has been expanding the realm of analytics with Web Data. They have published 1 research paper in UGC Approved Journal, 5 in Scopus Journals, and 3 in Web of Science.


The Department of Chemistry has published 4 research papers in UGC Approved Journals and 6 in Scopus Journals. The Department of Physics has made progress in research into new areas and continues its Guest Lecture series. The Department of Zoology has published 7 research papers in UGC Approved Journals and 10 in Scopus Journals. The Department of History has published 4 research papers in UGC Approved Journals. The college is focusing on establishing a strong research culture and involving students and faculty in research. The college also offers sports and games, with students excelling at all levels and sportswomen scaling new heights under the Physical Director Dr. R. Anista's leadership.

Our college was awarded 3. 5 Star Rating for Innovation by Ministry of Education, Government of India. Dr. V. Maheswari, Dr. K. Chitra Chellam, Dr. T. Sakthika, Dr. V. Sornalakshmi, Dr. R. Rajeswari were recognized as Innovation Ambassadors by the Ministry of Education, Government of India & and AICTE. Dr. V. Jeyanthikumari was awarded the Global Eminent Scientist Award by Vij Trust for her research contributions. She also received the Best Book Chapter Award from the Association of Global Academicians and Researchers (AGAR) in Tamil Nadu, India. Additionally, she was recognized as the Intellectual of the year 2020 by Rifacimento International. Dr. V. Maheswari was honored with the Global Eminent Researcher Award by VIJ Trust. Dr. K. Bala Deepa Arasi received the Women Researcher Award from VDGOOD Professional Association. Dr. K. Sivagama Shunmuga Sundari was acknowledged as a Young Achiever by EMG - SSM Trust. A. Alagu Lakshmi, III B. Com, developed the Oasis VR Device prototype. Dr. K. Kohila Subathra Christy was recognized as the Institutional Ambassador for implementing IFERP activities by the Institute for Engineering Research and Publication. Fifty teaching faculty and sixteen non-teaching faculty have attended FDPs. Six faculty have attended Refresher Courses and four of them have attended Induction Programmes. Twelve Faculty Development Programmes have been organized for the teaching faculty and one for the non-teaching faculty by the institution.

The college had a successful year with various student organizations, including the NCC Unit, NSS and YRC units, Road Safety Patrol, Fine Arts Cub, Women Empowerment Cell, Career Guidance Cell, Placement Cell, Eco Club, Networking and Communications – Amenities Centre, Health Club, and Coaching Classes. The college is happy to have launched 19 BDU courses and 8 addon courses, broadening our academic offerings this academic year. Students completed fieldwork projects and internships this year to expand their expertise in diverse subjects.

In response to the nation-wide call to improve research in institutions of higher education in the country, we have begun to focus our energies on establishing a strong research culture in the campus. I am happy to inform you that Dr. S. Uma Mageswari has been sanctioned a Minor Research Project under the sponsorship of the ICSSR. We published 119 UGC, 14 Scopus, 59 National, and 5 Web of Science research articles, as well as one book, demonstrating our commitment to intellectual study. The members of staff comprising 106 teaching and 23 non-teaching faculty members participated in 71 and 45 Faculty Development Programmes respectively, to enhance their education and professional growth. 

(2018 - 2019)

I am happy to present the annual report for the academic year 2018 - 2019. Established in 1973, the college has been guided by the principles of its founder, Kulapathi A.P.C. Veerabahu. The college has made significant contributions to the local community, particularly rural women who have suffered years of social oppression. The college motto, "Anbu, Arivu, and Aram" (Love, Knowledge and Virtue), reflects the institution's commitment to academic excellence and service to the needy. The college has a total of 1947 students and 100 teaching faculty, with a focus on providing access to higher education and extending support to the needy.

The academic year 2018-2019 has seen numerous accomplishments. The college's exemplary curricular performance is reflected in the University Examinations results, with a high percentage of students graduating from the institution. 25 students secured University Ranks this academic year. Six faculty members have attended Refresher Courses and nine members have attended Orientation Programmes. Faculty have also presented papers in 82 International, 59 National, and 35 State Level seminars and published research articles in 41 International, 21 National, and 11 State Level journals. Two books and 3 book chapters have been published. Various departments of our college have organized 8 International, 6 National and 5 State Level Seminars and Workshops. The Student Union and various Associations have organized 13 Guest Lectures, 20 Departmental Co-curricular Competitions, one Inter-collegiate Competition, and one exhibition. 21 scholars were awarded Ph.D. degrees this year, and 35 are pursuing their research.

The co-curricular activities at the institution include participation in the Thirukkural Peravai, State Level Shakespeare Institute Examinations, tests on teachings by Swami Vivekananda, and a MS University certified Certificate & Diploma Course in Gandhian Thought. Additionally, students engage in multi-disciplinary research through the peer-reviewed journal ENRICH, and contribute to departmental magazines like CHEMTALK (Chemistry) and SCRIBL (English). Our faculty serve as members of Board of Studies in academic bodies.

NSS Unit 47 & 57 have been actively involved in a variety of impactful activities and programmes. They organized an awareness programme on the "Importance and Uses of Yoga" for International Yoga Day, participated in the Swachcha Bharat Summer Internship programme, honored the National Flag Tiranga through a 'Tiranga March' and organized an awareness rally to promote a Plastic Free District in Thoothukudi. These activities demonstrate their commitment to social awareness and community engagement.

Career Guidance and Placement Cell offered Value Added Courses including Spoken English, Spoken Hindi, Coaching for Competitive Examinations, Jewelry Making, Aari Work, Hand Work, Personal Grooming and Tailoring. Campus interviews were conducted by IDBI Federal Life Insurance Corporation Ltd., Erode, Blue Ocean Personnel & Allied Services, Chennai, and Annai Jewellers, Pvt., Ltd., for the posts of sales assistant, cashier, data entry operator and supervisor. The college has undertaken various development initiatives and collaborations to enhance student learning. These include signing an MoU with Triumphant Institute of Management (T.I.M.E), conducting online assessment tests with Hire Mee Company, providing English language skills training through EXCEL Club, and facilitating English proficiency tests with the Shakespeare Institute of English Studies. The college has also received the Best Performing College Trophy from Shakespeare Institute of English Studies. Student clubs like the Health Club, Rotaract Club, Social Service League, Youth Red Cross, and Road Safety Patrol have been active in organizing events.

The Women Empowerment Cell has signed MoU with the Indian Medical Association, Tuticorin branch. Additionally, the college has conducted interdepartmental competitions, faculty development programs, orientation sessions for freshers and parents. The IQAC has initiated events like "Traditional Practices and Science: A Cultural Extravaganza" have been successfully organized, showcasing the college's commitment to holistic development and academic excellence. The IQAC has organized five FDPs for teaching faculty and one for nonteaching faculty.

In terms of scholarships and endowments, the college offers various scholarships including State Government/Central Government Scholarships, BC/SC Scholarships, Adi-Dravidar Loan Scholarship, Manonmaniam Sundaranar University Merit Scholarship, Scholarship for Physically handicapped, Mahalaxmi Ammal Endowment Scholarship, Adhoc Merit Grant, Tamilnadu Educational Trust Scholarship, and Bright Student Awards. These initiatives aim to support and recognize the academic achievements of students at A.P.C. Mahalaxmi College for Women.
