THE COLLEGE

The college was established by the individual initiative of Kulapathy A.P.C.Veerabahu, the Founder President. The foundation stone was laid on 2nd July 1973 and the college started to function with the initial strength of 212 students. In 1974 the college was shifted to the new building situated in a serene atmosphere in Sankaraperi, Thoothukudi which was chosen with foresight by the Founder President. The college has been developing in leaps and bounds since then. Mrs.Subbulakshmi Chockalingam is the Secretary of the institution right from the beginning. Thiru.A.P.C.V.Chockalingam is the President of the institution.

THE FOUNDER PRESIDENT

The Founder President being propelled by his ambition to emancipate the women in and around Thoothukudi, contemplated on the establishment of a women's college as there was only one women's college in the city then.

With firm determination and selfless devotion the Founder President, Kulapathy A.P.C.Veerabahu ventured to start A.P.C.Mahalaxmi College for Women, under the auspices of the V.O.C. Educational Society named after his step-mother Tmt.A.P.C.Mahalaxmi Ammal.

INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

CLASS HOURS

1. The college working time is from 9.10 a.m to 4.00 p.m.
2. The first bell for classes is rung at 9.05 a.m and the second bell at 9.10 a.m.
3. At the first bell, students should go to their respective classes and take seat so as to be present when a professor enters the class. Upon her entrance all students should stand until the prayer song broadcast from office. Students will then take their seats, as directed by the professor.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance in the college is compulsory. Further a student must put in a minimum of 75% attendance to be eligible to write the semester examinations. Students with less than 75% attendance will have to repeat the semester after the stipulated duration of the course. Regular attendance is a must. No one shall be absent from class without proper reason. The members of the staff shall take attendance at the beginning of each period.

A student who is not in the class, when the attendance is taken shall be marked absent. If a student absents herself even for one hour, she will lose attendance for that session. The attendance of each student will be totalled at the end of the semester. Periodic intimation will be sent to the parent or guardian of the student for information and suitable action.

LEAVE AND ABSENCE

A student requiring leave must apply in the prescribed leave form. She should state in the leave form the reason for her leave. The leave letter counter signed by the parent must be forwarded through the tutor.

Absence without proper leave letter would be severely dealt with. Students who have to leave the class during the session for any valid reason can do so after obtaining permission from the Principal. She can leave the campus only after getting the gate pass from the office.

All the scholarship/fee concession holders should earn 90% of attendance, failing which the entire scholarship/fee concession amount has to be refunded to

the Government as per G.O.Ms.No.1537 Social Welfare Department dated 20.04.1983.

LEAVE ON OTHER DUTY

Students who represent the college in sports and games or in competitions, such as fine arts, quiz and elocution etc. or in NSS /NCC /RSP / YRC camps are given credit of attendance for the period. They should fill the proper forms and get them counter signed by the professors-in-charge, before they leave the college for participation. Those who fail to do so will be considered absentees.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

1. Students of the college are to conform to the best traditions of Indian national life.
2. Students should avoid doing anything by word or deed that may disturb the unity and harmony of life in the college. The college is above politics and stands for all communities. Students are forbidden from indulging in any kind of political and communal activities.
3. On meeting the Principal and the members of the staff, students should greet them.
4. Loitering and making noise in the verandahs, reading room and library are strictly forbidden.
5. Students are expected to cooperate with authorities in keeping the premises of the college clean and tidy. They are earnestly requested to avoid writing on the wall, throwing bits of paper in the lecture halls, verandahs or anywhere in the premises. Any infringement of this rule will be severely dealt with.
6. Students are expected to dress modestly.
7. No student is allowed to leave the class room during working hours without the permission of the member of the staff concerned.
8. In any official tournament or match where the college takes part, no student shall play for an outside team without previous permission of the Principal.
9. While attending a public meeting students should be decently dressed. They should be respectful to seniors and superiors, polite and courteous to all.
10. Students are expected to be punctual.
11. Late comers will be asked to stay back for an hour in the library in the evening.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

Each semester consists of 90 working days excluding the semester examination days. Three Internal tests are conducted for the students every semester. Papers are duly evaluated and marks brought to the notice of the students and parents.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATIONS

External examination will be of three hours duration for all the theory and practical papers. Students are expected to maintain utmost honesty and good behaviour during the conduct of the examination. They should maintain silence in the examination hall and co-operate in the orderly conduct of the examination.

MANONMANIAM SUNDARANAR UNIVERSITY CODE

1. If any student is found talking or laughing in the exam hall, or trying to copy from her neighbour's script, she will be warned, and if the invigilator deems it fit the student will have to move to a different seat.

2. If a student is found copying from some manuscript or printed sheet or from any other incriminating material, or is found possessing any such material, she will be prevented from writing the examination. The invigilator concerned will seize the incriminating material, confiscate the Hall ticket, Identity Card and answer script of the student, and provide a statement of her own along with the student and that of the Chief Superintendent who will forward it to the Controller of Examinations. The student may be permitted to appear for the subsequent papers on condition. Later, the student will be asked to appear before the Appeals and Grievance Committee appointed by Controller of Examinations, to decide the sanctions against her for malpractice. The sanction will vary according to the gravity of the fault, ie., from being debarred from one paper or all the papers of one semester, or being debarred from two or three subsequent semesters if necessary.

3. Post-examination discovery of malpractice will be referred to the Controller of Examination by the Examiner. The Controller will refer the matter to the Appeals and Grievance Cell for a decision. (The rules prevailing in M.S. University regarding malpractice and those framed by our Academic council will serve as guidelines) If a student is found indulging in malpractice in any internal

assessment test she will be awarded zero for that test. Disciplinary action will be taken by the Principal if the student is caught again for malpractice.

ISSUING CERTIFICATES

Any student, previous or present, wishing to obtain a transfer or conduct certificate must apply to the college office in the prescribed form. Certificates will generally be issued only after getting application from the students. Certificate will generally be issued only after getting application from the students. Certificate will be sent by post, if the application is enclosed with self addressed, stamped envelope.

The student who wants to get her transfer certificate should come in person with one of her parents.

DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS

(CFR.TAMILNADU EDUCATIONAL RULES ('1973) (Nos.93 – 98)

1. Students are forbidden to organize or attend any meeting without the explicit permission of the Principal.
2. No student who has been convicted of any offence in a criminal court will be allowed to continue her studies in the college.
3. Students should abstain from active participation in party or communal politics.
4. Students who indulge in political propaganda or who organise fellow students into political factions in the premises of the college or hostel, or who otherwise engage themselves in party politics are liable to be expelled from the college and hostel.
5. Under the educational rules of the Tamilnadu Government (1978) the Principal has full power to inflict the following punishment; fine, loss of term certificate, suspension and expulsion from the college, if any student is guilty of rudeness of behaviour and gross breach of conduct rules.
6. Students should not indulge in any activity leading to the disruption of peace and discipline and dislocation of normal work in the college and hostel premises by resorting to strike. Those who are guilty of violation of this rule will be severely dealt with.
7. Ragging of any kind is strictly forbidden. Any one who is guilty of ragging will be summarily and severely punished.
8. Students who are guilty of (i) rude language towards the staff of the college or hostel (ii) assault or attempt to assault staff or fellow students of the college or hostel will be expelled from the institution.

9. If a college professor or a lecturer by speech or otherwise seeks to mislead her students into activities deemed objectionable, she is to be punished for dereliction of duty.

CODE OF ETHICS FOR TEACHERS (Adopted from UGC)

1. TEACHERS AND THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES:

Whoever adopts teaching as a profession assumes the obligation to conduct her in accordance with the ideal of the profession. A teacher is constantly under the scrutiny of his students and the society at large. Therefore, every teacher should see that there is no incompatibility between his precepts and practice. The national ideals of education which have already been set forth and which she should seek to inculcate among students must be her own ideals. The profession further requires that the teachers should be calm, patient and communicative by temperament and amiable in disposition.

Teachers should:

- (i) Adhere to a responsible pattern of conduct and demeanor expected of them by the community;
- (ii) Manage their private affairs in a manner consistent with the dignity of the profession;
- (iii) Seek to make professional growth continuous through study and research;
- (iv) Express free and frank opinion by participation at professional meetings, seminars, conferences etc. towards the contribution of knowledge;
- (v) Maintain active membership of professional organizations and strive to improve education and profession through them;
- (vi) Perform their duties in the form of teaching, tutorial, practical, seminar and research work conscientiously and with dedication;
- (vii) Co-operate and assist in carrying out functions relating to the educational responsibilities of the college and the university such as: assisting in appraising applications for admission, advising and counseling students as well as assisting the conduct of university and college examinations, including supervision, invigilation and evaluation; and
- (viii) Participate in extension, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities including community service.

2. TEACHERS AND THE STUDENTS

Teachers should:

- (i) Respect the right and dignity of the student in expressing her opinion;
- (ii) Deal justly and impartially with students regardless of their religion, caste, political, economic, social and physical characteristics;
- (iii) Recognize the difference in aptitude and capabilities among students and strive to meet their individual needs;
- (iv) Encourage students to improve their attainments, develop their personalities and at the same time contribute to community welfare;
- (v) Inculcate among students scientific outlook and respect for physical labour and ideals of democracy, patriotism and peace;
- (vi) Be affectionate to the students and not behave in a vindictive manner towards any of them for any reason;
- (vii) Pay attention to only the attainment of the student in the assessment of merit;
- (viii) Make themselves available to the students even beyond their class hours and help and guide students without any remuneration or reward;
- (ix) Aid students to develop an understanding of our national heritage and national goals; and
- (x) Refrain from inciting students against other students, colleagues or administration.

3. TEACHERS AND COLLEAGUES

Teachers should:

- (i) Treat other members of the profession in the same manner as they themselves wish to be treated;
- (ii) Speak respectfully of other teachers and render assistance for professional betterment;
- (iii) Refrain from lodging unsubstantiated allegations against colleagues to higher authorities; and
- (iv) Refrain from allowing considerations of caste, creed, religion, race or sex in their professional endeavour.

4. TEACHERS AND AUTHORITIES

Teachers should:

- (i) Discharge their professional responsibilities according to the existing rules and adhere to procedures and methods consistent with their profession in initiating steps through their own institutional bodies and/or professional organizations for change of any such rule detrimental to the professional interest;
- (ii) Refrain from undertaking any other employment and commitment

including private tuitions and coaching classes which are likely to interfere with their professional responsibilities;

- (iii) Co-operate in the formulation of policies of the institution by accepting various offices and discharge responsibilities which such offices may demand;
- (iv) Co-operate through their organizations in the formulation of policies of the other institutions and accept offices;
- (v) Co-operate with the authorities for the betterment of the institutions keeping in view the interest and in conformity with dignity of the profession;
- (vi) Should adhere to the conditions of contract;
- (vii) Give and expect due notice before a change of position is made; and
- (viii) Refrain from availing themselves of leave except on unavoidable grounds and as far as practicable with prior intimation, keeping in view their particular responsibility for completion of academic schedule.

5. TEACHERS AND NON-TEACHING STAFF:

Teachers should treat the non-teaching staff as colleagues and equal partners in a cooperative undertaking, within every educational institution; and Teachers should help in the function of joint staff-councils covering both teachers and the non-teaching staff.

6. TEACHERS AND GUARDIANS

Teachers should:

Try to see through teachers' bodies and organizations, that institutions maintain contact with the guardians, their students, send reports of their performance to the guardians whenever necessary and meet the guardians in meetings convened for the purpose for mutual exchange of ideas and for the benefit of the institution.

7. TEACHERS AND SOCIETY

Teachers should:

- (i) Recognize that education is a public service and strive to keep the public informed of the educational programmes which are being provided;
- (ii) Work to improve education in the community and strengthen the community's moral and intellectual life;
- (iii) Be aware of social problems and take part in such activities as would be conducive to the progress of society and hence the country as a whole;
- (iv) Perform the duties of citizenship, participate in community

activities and shoulder responsibilities of public offices;

- (v) Refrain from taking part in or subscribing to or assisting in any way activities, which tend to promote feeling of hatred or enmity among different communities, religions or linguistic groups but actively work for National Integration.

INSTRUCTIONS TO PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

1. Parents and guardians are earnestly requested to keep in touch with the Principal from time to time. They may meet the Principal at least once in a semester to ascertain the progress and conduct of their wards.
2. It is in the interest of the student that all the fees and other dues to the college or the hostel are paid by the parent or guardian directly in the Central Bank of India (Branch Office) in the campus. The college office keeps an account of such remittances and payments.
3. Parents and guardians of the students who do not reside in the college hostel but reside in hostels outside the campus are requested to ensure the safety of their wards. The place of stay must be intimated to the college office.
4. Every effort will be made to inform the parents or guardian about any instance of serious misconduct on the part of their wards. If there is no response from the side of the parents or guardian, they should comply with any action taken by the institution against the student.

STUDENT AMENITIES

Library

1. The general library and the department libraries are open to the members of the staff and the students of the college.
2. The library will be open on all working days from 9.00a.m to 4p.m. During vacation, the library will remain open on notified days between 10a.m and 1p.m.
3. Books will be issued during the tea-break and during the zero hours.
4. The books borrowed from the library must be returned on the date marked on the date slip which would be a week's duration. It will be re-issued twice if there is no demand for the book from others. The book must be brought to the library at the time of renewal.
5. If a student fails to return a book on the due date a fine of Re.1 per day will be levied. Sundays and holidays being excluded.
6. Absence from the college will not be ordinarily admitted as an excuse for a delay in returning the books.

7. On borrowing a book from the library the student must examine it and any damage thereof must be brought to the notice of the librarian immediately, failing which, the student will be responsible for the damage.
8. Sub-lending of library books is strictly prohibited.
9. Students are instructed to use the library books with care. Marking, underlining, writing anything or tearing of pages in books is forbidden. Disciplinary action will be taken against students in such cases.
10. The librarian may recall any book at any time without assigning reason.
11. Reference books or periodicals will not be lent on any circumstances.
12. Strict silence must be maintained in the library. Any assistance required shall be extended by the Librarian and the library assistants.
13. Grievances if any, shall be addressed to the Librarian and the Principal.
14. Best Library user every year, is honoured with an award.
15. INFLIBNET and browsing facilities are available.

Hostel

Hostel facility is available for the students. Rooms are spacious and well furnished. Beds are provided.

Banking Facility

The Central Bank of India is operating a branch office within the campus for the benefit of the staff and students of our college. All the payments are to be made only at this counter.

Canteen

A canteen functions from 8.30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Snacks, beverages, breakfast and lunch are available in the canteen. The canteen caters to the need of the staff and the students.

Vehicle Shed

Facility is provided to the members of the staff and students to park their four / two wheelers in the shed available for the purpose.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

Career Guidance and Placement Cell

The Career Guidance and Placement Cell creates awareness among the students about the avenues open to them to get employment. A committee under the chairmanship of the Principal has been constituted to monitor, supervise and conduct programmes and make the students realize the objectives of the cell.

Women Empowerment Cell

The Cell for women enlightens the students on legal rights of women and the remedies for the evils of dowry system and eve-teasing. The Cell offers a course on Women studies to the students of I PG. It also conducts awareness programmes and competitions pertaining to women.

Counselling Cell

Students are extended personal counselling by the members of staff under the auspices of this cell. Mentor-mentee system is followed.

Anti-ragging Cell

Ragging in any form either in words or in action is a crime as per Supreme Court orders. The Anti-Ragging Cell of the college ensures that no such offence takes place within the premises.

Internal Complaints Cell

The Committee ensures safety and protection of women in the campus.

Grievance Redressal Cell

The Grievance Redressal Cell of the institution addresses the grievances of any of the students and tries to seek redressal for the same.

The Centre nurtures start ups and gives them a chance to grow stronger. It promotes the entrepreneurial spirit of the start ups.
