Programmes Conducted:

A Departmental wise alumnae meeting was conducted on 15th August 2022. Alumnae shared their wonderful memories. Students entertained them with cultural programme.



The APCian Alumnae Association of A.P.C. Mahalaxmi College for Women, Thoothukudi organised an Educational Exhibition on the topic “Arts and Science Gallery” for school students of IX to XII standard on 30th August 2022 in the college campus with the aim of promoting creativity and learning skills among college students and for imparting knowledge to school students. The exhibition was inaugurated by Dr.S. Banumathi, Head and Associate Professor, P.G and Research

Department of Tamil in the august presence of respected Principal, Dr. P. Bala Shunmuga Devi at 10.00 a.m. The students of 13 departments, arts and science, prepared models related to their disciplines exhibited in halls allotted to each department. 34 halls were allotted to the departments. Each hall revealed the team work of students who by means of their exhibits and presentation inspired and shared their expertise to the school students. The Department of English showcased different literary figures and genres like Gothic literature exhibit, Harry Potter themed exhibit of fantasy literature and Shakespeare exhibits. Physics department exhibited working models on the topic "Scientific Aspects in Spirituality and Nationalism". Zoology department had miniaquarium and more than 300 specimens of paramecium, marine sponge, sea anemone, mollusca, octopus, placenta of human, sheep and so on. The department also exhibited the models of spot DNA extraction, portable vacuum cleaner, and hanging bird nest made of hay and coir. Department of Computer Science showcased models of computer topology, projector, ATM, satellite communication, robots and presented animations, virtual reality and hologram by means of audio-video aids. The students of history department exhibited models and posters on the topic "History and Archaeology" and conducted a tableau on the topic "Unsung Heroes and Heroines of Freedom Movement". The students also filled the hall with the posters of Mahatma Gandhi from his early childhood till his death, and spectacles, chappals, religious book reading stand used by the Mahatma. The department of Tamil exhibited models related to Tamil medicines, games of Tamilians and science in Tamil literature. Students of Chemistry Department conducted exciting experiments using colourful chemicals. Department of Mathematics exhibited models and conducted games on the topic "Applications of Mathematics". Students from Departments of Commerce showcased their exhibits on the topic "Trade and Banking" and models of ATM machine, international trade, communication process, career options for commerce graduates, organic farm, and entrepreneurship were exhibited. Posters of top 10 businessmen in the world, educators, economist, industrialists, women entrepreneurs and modern banking were pasted on the walls and paintings, arts and crafts made by the students were also exhibited in the halls. The Department of Physical Education exhibited models and posters related to traditional games of India. Bookmarks imprinted with the name of the department and relevant quotes and images were distributed to school students as a token of remembrance. The exhibits of each department were unique and were highly appreciated by the school teachers who accompanied the students. 330 students from 14 schools in Thoothukudi

district attended the exhibition. Feedback about the exhibition was collected from school teachers. The interaction between the college and school students and also among the teachers was seen to develop networking skills that would guide the school students to select the best educational opportunity. This educational exhibition served as a good learning experience for school students and also a platform for them to choose a right career for their future.
